### **Knox's New (Interim) Music Director**

You may have heard through church service announcements, or the Knox grapevine, that we have hired a new Interim Music Director, **Alex Lank.** 

Alex comes to Knox with a wonderful music background. He has been music director at churches in Ontario and Nova Scotia. He is a piano and drum teacher here in Guelph, and a freelance musician playing music gigs across many genres, in addition to working at Marden Library. His passion for music, and for bringing the organ and piano to life are very evident – you may have noticed, when he played at Knox in April and over the winter. Alex will start with us on June 7<sup>th</sup>.

# Hello Knox Family and Friends:

As you may have heard, the worship committee is urgently looking for aid:

Brian Redpath and Phil Gordon have been the primary providers for the Livestream components and the sound/audio components for many years now. Both gentlemen are doing amazing work which allows our worship to be shared - and both gentlemen have been filling these rolls with uncomplaining service.

Now, it is time for some back-up plans.

I am asking you to *prayerfully consider* if someone you know would consider helping in these roles. This may be yourself, a friend, neighbour, niece, nephew, grandchild, young or older... The frequency can be discussed with Brian and Phil, but they would love to have the occasional Sunday off to sit with their families, or not worry about vacations, or sick days, or unexpected emergencies.

**Sound Booth:** This is a role that can be trained quite quickly, just by sitting with Phil on a Sunday morning or two. Your time commitment would be from 10:10 on a Sunday morning, until end of service. Please speak to Phil if you (or a loved one) would be willing to help in this capacity. Frequency: flexible!

**Livestream:** This has two components:

**Pre-service:** Seeking one or two capable folks to work from your computer/laptop. You would be creating the "overlays" for the service (hymn lyrics, scripture verses - all the words that go across the bottom of the screen). This position will take approximately 2 (or so) hours a week, and can be completed fully from your own home!

**During Service:** Seeking folks to be trained on the operation of the livestream equipment for a Sunday morning service. Brian will offer extensive training, to ensure familiarity and comfort with the livestream equipment. The time commitment, once trained, is 10:10 Sunday morning, and for a few minutes after service, to wrap up loose threads. Frequency: once every 6weeks or so - TBD with Brian.

Again - please pray, and please ask around. Working the Knox YouTube equipment is a unique opportunity that may appeal to unexpected sources. Please reach out to Brian R, Phil G, or Carrie G with any questions. Thank You!




# Knox Picnic - Sunday, June 11 - Marden Park Pond-Pavilion

## A Spring Update From the LOGOS Board

The Logos Board held a meeting on April 19<sup>th</sup>, for the purpose of making some decisions about continuing the Logos Ministry considering some of the challenges we faced this past year.

The Board has made the decision to offer Logos in Fall 2023 for a 10-week session with a week off at the halfway point. If the Fall session runs smoothly, with an adequate number of regularly attending volunteers, a second 10-week session may be offered in the winter. Here are the Fall dates: Sept 20<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, Oct 4<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>, Nov 1<sup>st</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. (Oct 25<sup>th</sup> will be the week off.) Families will register and pay for each session separately.

Logos is all about developing and fostering meaningful relationships. We begin with our relationship with God, but after that the relationships referred to are relationships between adults and adults, adults and children and children and children. Logos is a ministry for all ages. All generations are welcome and there is a role for everyone.

The timing of each Logos evening will be changed slightly. In an effort to alleviate the afternoon rush and give more time to find parking, Family Time will be a bit more compressed. We will start at 5:15pm sharp. Dinner will run from 5:15-5:35, Family Time Activity will be from 5:35-5:55 and Circle Time will be from 5:55-6:00. If we run overtime, class times will be adjusted accordingly.

We are hoping for a new Lead Minister and a new Lead Musician to add to the fun. These two new leaders will be members of the Logos Board and important contributors to the Logos Ministry. We will continue to pray for the members of the Committees who will be searching for the right people to fill these two important positions.

#### **Downtown Guelph Update**

# Baker District construction: what to expect



Baker District is a landmark city-building initiative that will bring more visitors and residents Downtown, create more jobs and enhance the vitality of our Downtown. Last month we resumed construction on the sewer and other underground work to support the redevelopment of this area. The installation of services and reconstruction of Baker Street, Chapel and Park Lanes will be ongoing in stages until the Fall. This map shows the proposed stages of construction and the approximate timing for the work to be completed.

#### Status update:

- Stage 1 work is complete
- Stage 2 work is underway
- Stage 3 work is also already underway (ahead of schedule)
- Stage 4 work is still to come

**Please keep in mind:** Construction timing is fluid, and the current schedule is highly dependent on several factors including weather, and the complexity of working around existing services and utilities in the area. We'll provide updates via this newsletter and in-person (from the City contractor) should this schedule change significantly.

Working with our contractors, the City will make every effort to maintain access to short-term loading, pick-up, drop-off, driveways, parking garages and private parking lots in the construction areas.

# **Moments from Mission & Outreach**

The Mission and Outreach Committee continues to work to rejuvenate Knox's outreach initiatives and this spring has seen the beginning of our "Give to Guelph" food program in support of Chalmers. Knox has participated in food donations for years, but in response to the growing food insecurity in our local community, the committee decided to re-invigorate our collective commitment. Our Sunday School and Logos youth creatively painted sanctuary donation bins and decorated the large donation bin as well this spring. We have had 2 successful "Give to Guelph" Sundays on April 16<sup>th</sup> and May 21<sup>st</sup>, already greatly increasing Knox's food donations to Chalmers. On the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of each month, the beautiful bins are brought out to the sanctuary for donations (donations will still be gratefully received every Sunday throughout the month). Donations are picked up the week following the "Give to Guelph" Sunday by a Chalmers volunteer for distribution through their programs. Each month, Chalmers highlights some items for considered donations. For the month of June, donations of canned vegetables and peanut butter from Knox are being encouraged. Skim milk powder and toilet paper are always needed. All donations are gratefully received. Moving forward into the summer months, our "Give to Guelph" Sunday dates include June 18<sup>th</sup>, July 16<sup>th</sup> and August 20<sup>th</sup>. Thanks Knox family!

In other news, an Al Sawal Family Update: June 1, 2023 will mark 6 years since we welcomed the the Al Sawal family to Canada. On May 17, 2023, the three oldest children, Fidaa, Hasan, and Mohamad became Canadian citizens!
