Moments from Mission & Outreach

The Mission and Outreach Committee has been meeting throughout the summer and is excited to share some of our fall mission projects with you!

Give to Guelph: As of July, Knox's rejuvenated commitment to this food donation program had donated 628lbs of food to Chalmers! Amazing, thank you! We are making a difference to those facing food insecurity here in our own community. During our communications with Chalmers, we have heard from representatives that they appreciate our donations so much and are deeply grateful. We will continue to have our Give to Guelph Sundays on the 3rd Sunday of each month, and donations are also possible at any time during each month to the decorated donation bin.

Each month, Chalmers highlights some items for considered donations.

For September, donations of kidney beans or baked beans, and peanut butter are being encouraged. For October, pasta, brown rice and peanut butter are our highlighted items. Skim milk powder and toilet paper are always needed. All donations are gratefully received.

Run for the Cure: We are pleased to share that Knox's participation in the CIBC Run for the Cure in partnership with St. Andrew's is happening again this year! The big day is Sunday, October 1st! St. Andrew's generously hosted our congregations last year, so this year participants and those wishing to cheer us on will gather at Knox to go together to the start line, and then come back to Knox for refreshments after their participation, with our Sunday service at Knox to follow. As this newsletter is being prepared, we are working with St. Andrew's in the final stages of registering our team "Presbyterians on the Run"; please "stay tuned" for all the details VERY SOON! As soon as everything is "live" the Mission & Outreach committee will share all the details of how to sign up to be a participant or to donate and support the Canadian Cancer Society and our Guelph Presbyterian team. If you are considering participating, please know that everyone, of all ages, are most welcome to walk or run, and that there are 1k and 5K options so the choice is yours, we'd love to have you join us!

Refugee Fund: For many years now, Knox, St. Andrew's and Two Rivers have worked collaboratively to maintain a refugee fund to sponsor refugees (Syrian and Ukrainian most recently) and support these families after they arrive in our community. The fund continues to be well managed, but we are cognizant of the need to maintain these monies for needs as they arise, which is a very real reality today. Donations to the Refugee fund are always warmly and gratefully received. St. Andrew's hosted a successful "Find it on the Lawn" sale and event on August 26th. The Knox Mission & Outreach Committee is working on plans to have a table at Knox's upcoming Fall Festival, with all proceeds from this table going to the Refugee fund. We will keep you informed of our plans and how you can help us as we prepare for this event. Thank you in advance for your support.

Let's rock some socks Knox! With the fall weather coming our way soon, often our thoughts turn to warm and cozy clothing items, including socks. Many in our local Guelph community that are facing financial uncertainty find these added clothing items an area of need as the fall and winter seasons arrive. During the month of October, we need **your** help! The congregation in collaboration with the Logos youth will be focusing on collecting donations of new socks, both adult and children's sizes, throughout the month. *The challenge to our Knox family*: how many pairs can we collect and rock socks at Knox, making it a very "Sock-ta-bulous Sock-tober" indeed?



On June 16, after a long year of preparation, GCVI's Chamber Choir left Guelph for New York City to perform at Carnegie Hall. We had been invited to join an ensemble chorus in a performance by the New England Symphonic Ensemble with guest conductor Kira Omelchenko from Wilfrid Laurier University. On Friday night, after arriving in New York City, we were invited to join three members of the late David Bowie's band (Emm Gryner, Mark Plati, Everett Bradley) to perform with them during their show at City Winery. We performed the song *Life on Mars* with them and were called to sing along with many other songs. We spent the morning on Saturday at Carnegie Hall rehearsing for the show on Sunday afternoon. On Saturday afternoon, we visited the 9/11 memorial, Central Park, and Times Square before seeing the Broadway musical Wicked in the evening. On Sunday, we visited the Metropolitan Museum of Art before heading to Carnegie Hall for our 2:00 performance. We performed Ola Gjeilo's *Dreamweaver* with choirs from Easton, Pennsylvania and Longview, Texas, accompanied by the New England Symphonic Ensemble. These groups also performed the Latin piece *Cambridge Songs Suite No. 1* which we performed sections of as well. Many parents from Guelph (including my parents, Dave & Lisa) made the trip to watch the performance. After the performance, we had a dinner cruise around the Statue of Liberty. About 9:00 pm on Sunday, we boarded our bus for the overnight trip home to Guelph. We arrived at GCVI around 6:00 am Monday morning after a long but amazing weekend.
