As we prepare for the Fall days, I'm pleased to report that the search for an Interim Minister has been completed, and we will welcome the Rev. Cathy Stewart from Hamilton, ON onboard, sometime in October. Rev. Cathy, an ordained Presbyterian minister, has a great deal of experience in facilitating Congregational self-evaluation and change, and has been an Interim Minister in a few different settings. We are very fortunate and blessed to have her considerable skills available to us. There are a few approvals that still need to be processed, but I do not foresee any significant problems at this point. There will be a lot more to come in terms of becoming familiar with Cathy, but I want to suggest that she is not the Messiah! Rather, she is to be a faithful guide through Knox's process of self-evaluation, renewed strategic purpose, and preparation for a new Senior Minister. We are projecting for our contract to run until June 2025, with the proviso that it could be extended (no longer than a full two-year term, therefore Oct. 25), or, truncated if things came together more quickly than anticipated. Stay tuned for more details on welcoming Rev. Cathy.

I want to update you on our relationship with St. Andrew's Presbyterian. The joint committee met again and continue to enjoy excellent relations. They will continue to have creative conversations around joint fellowship, collaboration in ministry, and discernment on whether the Spirit may guide the two congregations into a future ministry together. I invite everyone to have an open mind, and to enjoy the current and upcoming collaborations.

We are pleased that our new Office Administrator Debbie Skirving seems to be adapting well to the new setting, and we are grateful for everyone's patience as we get the operation running smoothly.

Thanks be to God for growth opportunities! Change can be difficult, but, there is so much that God is able to do as we open ourselves to new possibilities.


